Uniform and Equipment Policy

Alberta Cricket Association is committed to providing and maintaining Alberta Representative Cricket Teams, Minor Cricket Camps, Minor Cricket League with players apparels, Sports Clothing and equipment necessary for its sports programs. Consistent with ICC regulations, apparel consists primarily of clothing items (warm-ups, sweats, uniforms, etc.). Equipment consists of items including, but not limited to, balls, bats, Gloves, Pads, Under Guards, Body Protective, Thai and Side Guards, Wickets, and Kit Bags.

Vice President has the primary responsibility for storage, maintenance, security and inventory of apparel and equipment, as well as ensuring compliance with all established policies and procedures.

Due to the substantial value and inventory of apparel and equipment, only authorized Cricket Coaches, Managers and Captains members are allowed access to the Equipment. Players and Umpires are not authorized to get access of equipment without prior approval of VP.

The VP is responsible for maintaining a current and accurate inventory of all athletic apparel and equipment. Coaches are required to provide the VP with documentation of any apparel or equipment they purchase to assist with inventory procedures. The VP is responsible for storing all apparel and equipment that is received. All incoming shipments should be examined and cross-checked against purchase documentation to ensure an accurate inventory count. All athletic apparel and equipment must conform to ICC regulations related to the use of manufacturer or distributor logos.

All apparel and equipment will be counted, including what is issued to players. A current inventory list of all athletic apparel and equipment will be provided to members upon request. The VP is responsible for ensuring that all new apparel and equipment is recorded in the inventory data prior to being issued.

All individuals who are issued Cricket equipment are subject to the following rules:

- Each individual is held responsible for all apparel and equipment that is issued for practice and competition. Any equipment that is lost, stolen or damaged will be charged to the individual.
- After the initial issuance of apparel or equipment, additional apparel or equipment is available on an exchange basis only. More specifically, replacement apparel or equipment will not be issued to individuals who leave their apparel or equipment at home.
- When traveling, each individual is responsible for ensuring that all articles are placed in his or her bag for the return to ACA. Any articles that are missing are the financial responsibility of the individual.

- ACA reserves the right to refuse service to any individual not conducting him or herself in an appropriate manner. The President will be notified of any such occurrence.

Such Player who is issued apparel/equipment is responsible for returning it in good condition (allowing for normal wear and tear) etc. All Players are required to return their apparel and equipment after the close of their sport's season. Each individual is held responsible for all apparel equipment that is issued for ACA practice and competition.

Players are responsible for lost apparel and equipment. Stolen apparel and equipment will not be replaced without a member's approval. A hold will be placed on the Player's account until the equipment is returned or payment is made to the ACA.

VP must provide the BOD with a copy of any sponsorship agreement involving apparel or equipment. The Secretary will provide copies of all sponsorship agreements involving apparel or equipment to the members in members meetings.

The VP, will be responsible for the care and laundering of competitive and practice apparel. Players are responsible for the daily inspection of their Equipment to ensure its safety and functionality The disposal of all apparel and equipment must be approved by board of directors.

All Members, players and the respective manufacturers of Cricket Clothing and Cricket Equipment used in the league must adhere to these Regulations, which apply to all Matches (including all friendly matches played by the Teams). Any clothing or equipment that does not comply with these Regulations is strictly prohibited.
